MANDATORY RULES FOR HHP REGISTRATION

All Household Pet registration applications will commence with an administrative prefix which would be nominally changed on the 1st January of each year.

The name, including the administrative prefix, should contain no more than 26 characters, including letters and or spaces, hyphens or apostrophes.

Names must differ by at least one letter from the name of any other cat registered with the GCCF. The following will not be accepted as a name or part of a name.

Numbers in figures, (Roman or Arabic)

Recognized feline titles (Champion, Premier, Supreme, International, Imperial etc)
Cedillas, accents ect.

Repetition of words previously registered by same person except appropriate breed, colour/pattern/coat description words in English, the definite and indefinite article (the, a, an) or recognized human titles, (Mr, Mister, Mrs, Miss, King, Queen, Prince, Princess, Lord, Lady, Sir, Dame).

NB Applications should ensure that they do not submit a business or trade name which might lead to legal action by the registered owner of that name.

No cat once registered can have its name changed in any particular, except at the discretion of the Board of Directors, whose decision is final.

Cats registered as Household Pets, will be registered on the Household Pet Register, this includes both Non-pedigree and Pedigree Household Pets.

When applying for a name, not including the administrative prefix, the name must contain a maximum of 18 characters including letters and or spaces, hyphens or apostrophes. A further two names must be supplied in case of duplicated names.
